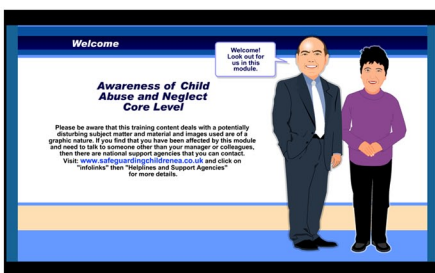




# e-learning available



## Awareness of Child Abuse and Neglect - 5 Versions Available

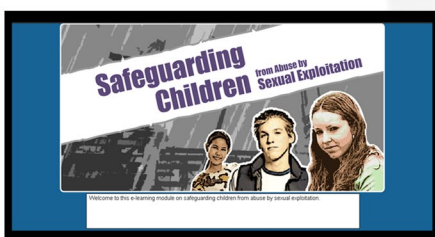
**NEW Introduction** - Short course suitable for Caretakers, Crossing Patrols, Dinner Ladies etc.

**Foundation** - Aimed at those people who have occasional contact with children; Gives comprehensive information, as well as what to do if a child discloses.

**Core** - This course is suitable for frontline professionals and has the same content as the Foundation, but with extra screens.

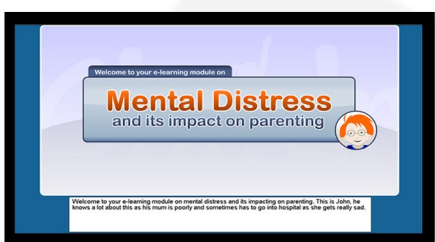
**NEW Young People** - Based on core version, suitable for those working with young people in schools

**NEW Think Safe, Be Safe, Stay Safe** - Suitable for 11- 18 year olds in peer mentoring or similar roles



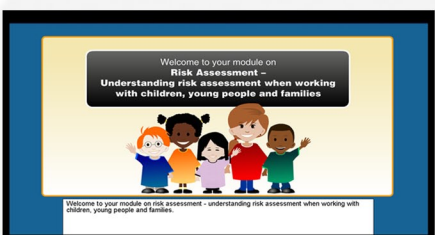
## NEW Safeguarding Children from Abuse by Sexual Exploitation

The average age of young people becoming involved in sexual exploitation is 11-13 years. This course is suitable for anyone who comes into contact with young people and aims to raise awareness of the risks and vulnerability factors, to facilitate early intervention and prevention.



## NEW Parental Mental Health

This course is suitable for all those working with families where parenting is affected by the impact of mental health problems and distress. It outlines the causes and symptoms of a variety of mental illnesses so that they can then appreciate the needs and experiences of all in the family and advise and support parents, carers and their children.



## NEW - Risk Assessment in Safeguarding Children and Young People

This course aims to help practitioners working with children and their families to understand the concept of risk management. Through key research and theory, the learner will develop the skills needed to analyse risk and adopt a balanced approach to safeguarding children when carrying out assessments.



## NEW - Safeguarding Everyone

This course aims to raise awareness that even where a practitioner's involvement is not primarily focussed on a certain member of the family they should take action to refer concerns and safeguard the entire family. Those working primarily with vulnerable children should do the Foundation or Core courses identified above as a first priority.
