Role

Third Sector Assembly Representative (Healthier Communities and Older People Partnership)

Role Purpose

Acting individually and collectively with other members of the Partnership, to contribute a voluntary and community perspective to discussions concerning the strategic direction of the Partnership and the effective delivery of local services.

The objectives of the Central Bedfordshire Healthier Communities and Older People Partnership are to:

- ensure the strategic direction, commitment and joint working with partners to achieve health improvements, reduction in health inequalities and improvements in adult social care and housing
- provide strategic oversight for the delivery of the national agenda and priorities for Social Care, Health and Housing and the implementation of *High Quality Care for All: NHS Next Stage Review*
- ensure a joint strategic approach to commissioning and that commissioning decisions reflect local priorities and targets
- coordinate the work of statutory organisations, with partners in the public, private, voluntary and community sectors to ensure that all strategies and action plans are properly integrated and reflect health improvement priorities
- oversee the performance and the delivery of Local Area Agreement (LAA) targets for Healthier Communities and Older People and support the developing Community Area Assessment (CAA) process and achievement of other significant national and local targets.

Main Responsibilities

- Preparing for, attending and contributing to Partnership meetings and other meetings the representative is invited to attend.
- Representing and advocating the views, interests and priorities of the voluntary and community sector at Partnership meetings and any other public meetings, conferences and forums attended as an Assembly representative.
- Contributing to the overall direction and development of the Partnership through clear strategic planning, in accordance with the Partnership's Terms of Reference.

- Using the Third Sector Assembly and own contacts to promote and publicise the Partnership, develop links with individuals and organisations, and encourage support for the work of the Partnership.
- Preparing written articles on the work of the Partnership for publication in local voluntary and community sector newsletters as a mechanism for reporting back to, and gathering views from, the sector.
- Attending meetings of the Third Sector Assembly and through this to gather, represent and feedback views to those they represent.
- Informing own effectiveness as a representative through reading, networking, training and an understanding of the issues affecting the work of the Partnership.

Person Specification

The initial term of office will be until May 2010. Thereafter, renewable in accordance with arrangements put in place for the election of representatives as part of the emerging Third Sector Assembly.

The person fulfilling this role is expected to:

- regularly attend Partnership meetings, usually held every two or three months during the day.
- have a commitment to partnership working and an understanding of community involvement processes;
- be involved in strategic issues and developments in, be able to contribute to decisions on behalf of, the voluntary and community sector in Central Bedfordshire;
- be able to analyse complex issues, identify priorities and communicate information clearly.
- have experience of representing the voluntary and community sector and/or local communities in public meetings and partnership settings;
- have experience of contributing to discussions and debates on, and knowledge of, a range of health and social care related issues relevant to local communities and the voluntary and community sector;
- be involved in a local 'frontline' voluntary, community or other third sector organisation delivering services in Central Bedfordshire and have a proven involvement with the wider third sector;
- be committed to the vision and priorities included in the Sustainable Community Strategy.
